Latest News

We've been busier than ever in the last few months with lots of activity going on and some important and notable successes to be proud of.

Here are some of the highlights:

Queen Elizabeth II Field. We're delighted by the success of our campaign to have London Road Playing Fields designated a Queen Elizabeth II Field. This follows on from our efforts which resulted in Figges Marsh being put forward as a Queen Eiizabeth II Field.

The scheme is managed by Fields In Trust and is a celebration of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee and London Olympic and Paralympic Games. More information at www.fieldsintrust.org/QEII.aspx.

SITA survey. We surveyed lorry movements in and out of the SITA waste facility at Benedict Wharf. We monitored more than 250 lorries and found that two a minute went into or left the facility.

Our survey found an astounding 78 percent of vehicles used the narrow part of Church Road despite SITA

telling us it discourages use of this route. Many of these are large container lorries which can't pass each other in Church Road and are intimidating to users of the narrow pavement.

SITA was disappointingly dismissive of our findings and has so far refused to take action. The full survey report is at our web site www.mitchamcricketgreen.org.uk/20 12/11/.

A Community Vision for Cricket Green. We are working with the Council's futureMerton team to help develop a community vision for Cricket Green. This is being promoted widely including on our web site.

HLF funding. We're extremely pleased and proud to have been awarded a £20,000 Heritage Lottery Fund grant. We have several projects planned see the separate story on this.

Our exciting Heritage Lottery Funded project – Know Your Cricket Green

We have secured £20,000 funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund to raise public awareness and understanding of the historic significance of Mitcham's Cricket Green through activities which promote the area and encourage local involvement.

Know Your Cricket Green comprises several projects. The first, taking place this Spring, includes cleaning and conservation of the cricket memorial stone and listed horse trough and milestone. The horse trough will be moved slightly back from its location at the corner of London Road and Cricket Green to protect it from traffic.

We will produce an audio trail to guide people around the heart of the area and record oral histories based on interviews with local people.

Later in 2013 we will organise a photographic exhibition of sporting history and introduce a geocache trail through which people can explore the area. We will also provide a Hall of Fame on our website with information and photographs of famous Mitcham residents.

Planning Inspector dismisses two appeals to develop Cricketers pub

Our long campaign to prevent demolition of the Cricketers pub for new flats has borne fruit with the rejection of two appeals by an independent Inspector.

This follows months of lobbying and an 8 hour planning hearing in January where we gave evidence.

The Inspector concluded that both the "contemporary" proposal (see our

front page picture) and a development based on "fake history" would "be detrimental to the character and appearance" of the Conservation Area.

This success is down to the hard work of everyone involved and the level of support which has been evident throughout from all those who wrote in, spoke about or attended meetings about the proposals.
