For the benefit of Mitcham Cricket Green Conservation Area and its environs This is a remarkable place made up of a complex of historic greens, buildings and designed landscapes, each with distinctive characters. These fit together to make a wonderful patchwork with open spaces, ancient pathways and listed buildings at every turn.

Sporting heritage

The area has a rich sporting heritage. There are many sporting 'firsts', and the open spaces have been a training ground for Olympic medallists dating back to the early part of the 20th century. Today the area is enjoyed by countless thousands of people for both fitness and pleasure.

We support Mitcham Cricket Club. It uses the ground where cricket has been played every season since 1685, longer than anywhere else in the world. Thousands once turned out to watch matches and there are strong associations







History and nature

The neighbourhood is valued as a place of tranquillity with ponds, wonderful trees and wildlife at every turn. An almost hidden walled garden is among the many delights to be found, while the listed Burn Bullock and White Hart pubs stand out as reminders of the past importance of the area's coaching inns.

A 500-year-old dovecote – one of the oldest buildings in Merton – stands next to an ancient carp pond in the setting of the listed Canons house. Whilst the parish church dates mostly from the Victorian period parts of the original Saxon church remain. Its churchyard contains many historically important graves and memorials – and is a valuable oasis of calm. Meanwhile the Methodist church on Cricket Green is one of just a handful of listed 20th century churches in England.
