We are Highly Commended in national Civic Voice Design Awards We were delighted when we learned that we'd been shortlisted for the prestigious Civic Voice 2015 Design Awards.

Only 12 projects throughout England were shortlisted for an award. We were in the Public Realm category – and shortlisted alongside three other projects for our Lottery funded Cleaning Local Landmarks project.

Representatives of MCGC&H attended the national awards ceremony at Central Hall Westminster, where Civic Voice President Griff Rhys Jones presented the awards. You can see our Highly Commended plaque on the front cover of this bulletin.

This is what the judges said about our project:

"An imaginative community led scheme to restore three historic local landmarks; a milestone, a memorial stone and a horse trough which have all played a part in the story of Mitcham. Local heritage is preserved, celebrated and brought meaningfully to life by and for local people, inspiring a new generation to learn about and appreciate how the present is firmly rooted in the past. A model of how to involve volunteers in heritage and how small interventions can cumulatively make a huge difference."

An old planning permission for flats on the **Kwik Fit site** on London Road site has lapsed, and a new owner has been consulting on a new plans.

The plan at the time of writing is for 22 flats and 280 square metres of ground floor commercial space. Our submitted comments to Merton Council include our view that the building is too high and bulky, overpowering for the location at the gateway to the conservation area and inappropriate to the size of the nearby housing. We expect a full planning application imminently.

We have become involved in work on the **contracting out of the management of green spaces**. We made a submission to Merton Council highlighting the detailed characteristics of the open spaces in Cricket Green to help inform the specification and ensure the distinctive character of our area is treated properly in any contract. We were pleased to see Merton Council's Planning Committee refuse an application for a **new bungalow** in the back garden of a property in Mitcham Park.

We do not generally get involved in domestic planning applications, but in this case we felt a precedent would be set if planning application was given, causing damage to the special character of this part of Cricket Green Conservation Area.

Bollards!

There is a new row of intrusive 'chalk stick' bollards along Cricket Green road opposite Date Valley School.

They were fitted quickly as a response to the incursion of travellers on this section of green space.

There are also garish metal posts which can be laid flat for vehicle access to the grass. One of these is in very insensitively located in the centre of the footpath opposite Cold Blows.

Fortunately, Merton Council agrees with us that the bollards are not appropriate, and we have been informed that they are a 'temporary measure' and will be replaced with something more appropriate.

What that will be, and when it will arrive we do not yet know. We are working with council officers to speed things along.

Burn Bullock and cricket pavilion update

Since our last Bulletin you will have noticed scaffolding around the Burn Bullock indicating that the works required on the listed building by Merton Council are underway. We hope this is at last the start of a new chapter in the life of this famous local pub.

We continue to work very closely with Mitcham Cricket Club to help the club achieve a secure future for the cricket pavilion, which is in the same ownership as the Burn Bullock.

Community on the Green a great success

Our Community on the Green event held on 29 July was a great success – thanks to everyone who came along to find out more about us and our work and to celebrate Cricket Green.

Highlights of the evening were: an excellent speech by Mayor of Merton David Chung, presentation of cheques to Mitcham Cricket Club by both Miltcham Cricket Green

Community & Heritage and Mitcham Society following our annual joint golf day earlier in the year and a guided walk round The Canons grounds. Cricket was played by young members of Mitcham Cricket Club.

This is only the second time we have held Community on the Green – and it looks like it is set to be an annual fixture!
