

History Nugget for October 2016: The Lodge Lampstands

Mitcham Baths Hall was built in 1932, and demolished in the 1980s. It was set back from the London Road, to allow for an anticipated widening of that road. There was an island at the roadside, and at each end was a lamp, mounted on iron stand: one for 'IN', the other for 'OUT'. There is a photo of the front of the Baths Hall, showing the 'IN' lampstand, in Eric Montague's book "Mitcham a Pictorial History".
