MITCHAM PARISH CHURCH St Peter & St Paul Anglican Church

Grade II* listed Georgian church built 1820 on site of 13th Century church. Many notable features including tombs and memorials. Picturesque graveyard.

- Photographic exhibition - notable

graves in the Parish Churchyard.

MITCHAM CRICKET CLUB

Cricket has reputedly been played on this ground since before 1685 - longer than anywhere else in the world. The pavilion, built in 1904, is rare in being separated from the ground by a road. Its balcony offers great views across the cricket ground.

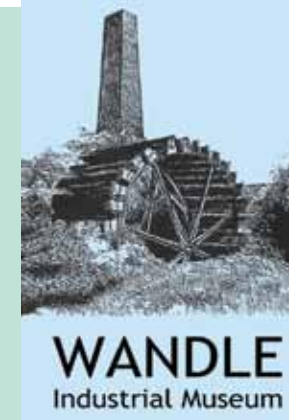

SAINTS PETER AND PAUL ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH

Built 1889 and locally listed.
